

BOWL GAMES GO ACCORDING TO MOST FORECASTS

Games Provided Many Despite "Partisan" Predictions Otherwise

Forecasters for most all the New Years Bowl Games were correct in their predictions, with Texas upsetting Georgia in the only upset of the dope bucket.

The east-west game at Kezar Stadium, San Francisco, came so near being another upset, when a fighting bunch of westerners gave the touted easterners a "bad afternoon," only to lose 14-12.

California, which had visions of upsetting Northwestern, did almost that, except Northwestern converted her "first downs" into "touchdowns," and came out on the long end of a 20-14 score.

Oregon, playing the highly-touted Southern Methodist, did as dopsters said they would, except that Oregon scored twice on the host team. VanBroeklin's passed fell from the hands of his receivers like from any high school lad's outstretched hands.

Their running game, which did show the most promise, bogged down badly on two scoring opportunities.

Six 'Hot' Driving Tips Furnished By Secretary of State

SALEM—Six "hot" tips on safe driving in the kind of weather that has been plaguing Oregon motorists recently are contained in a leaflet now being distributed by his office in an effort to center attention on the dangers of slippery highways, Secretary of State Earl T. Newbry has announced.

"Freezing weather is invariably accompanied by a wave of 'skidding' mishaps, most of them the result of unwariness or lack of 'know-how,'" Newbry said.

The leaflet, "Winter Winners", was prepared by the national committee on winter driving hazards. Results of numerous studies have been boiled down to simple safety suggestions designed to help the average driver recognize and cope with the dangers of rain, sleet, or snow.

In an effort to reach all who need reminders, Newbry suggested careful attention to the following pointers:

1. Get the "feel" of the road before you start out by trying your brakes while driving slowly and away from traffic.

2. Adjust speed to road and weather conditions. Slow down on wet, snowy and icy roads so you can stop when you have to.

3. Use tire chains on ice and snow. They cut down braking distances as much as 40 or 50 per cent. Nota cure-all for winter accidents, but they will help a careful driver.

4. Keep windshield and windows clear of snow and ice, fog and frost. Be sure headlights, the windshield wipers, and defrosters

are in good working order.

5. When you have to stop, pump your brakes up and down—jamming them on may lock them and throw your car into a skid.

6. Follow other vehicles at a safe distance—remember it takes from three to twelve times as long to stop on snow and ice as it does on dry concrete or macadam.
