

March Of Dimes Plan Announced

GOLD BEACH—The method for collecting 1949 March of Dimes will be substantially the same as those used in 1948, Curry County chairman, John C. Porisch announced.

Although the need for funds is greater than ever before, there will be no soliciting of business houses or homes. The policy of the county committee is to give every man, woman and child in the county an opportunity to make a voluntary contribution. Three methods of collection are being used:

1. School contribution cards have been supplied through the co-operation of the schools to all school children within the county.

2. March of Dimes contribution containers are being distributed to all business houses.

3. March of Dimes contribution cards are being mailed to box-holders from all post offices within the county. If you fail to receive such a card, your contribution may be sent to the March of Dimes, in care of your postmaster, or to your community chairman.

Many organizations are again taking an active part in March of Dimes campaign. The Sixes Grange is sponsoring a dance, the net proceeds to go to the March of Dimes, on Jan. 29. Plans to sponsor March of Dimes events are being made by veterans organizations in both Brookings and Gold Beach. The co-operation and contribution of all organizations will be welcomed by the community chairmen.

VETERANS' PENSIONS

The requirements for entitlement to benefits of total non-service pensions have been re-established as follows:

The age requirements at 55 to a 60% rating for one or more disabilities, with no percentage requirements for any one disability. The requirements at 60 will be 60% rating for one or more disabilities.

At 65 there will be no percentage requirement other than one disability ratable at 10% or more.

When these reduced requirements are met, and the disabilities involved are of a permanent nature, ratings as permanently and totally disabled will be assigned if the veteran is determined to be unable to obtain and follow substantially gainful employment by reason of such disability.

In making such determinations several guides are used, such as old jobs at less than half the usual hours of work or less than half the usual remuneration will not be considered incompatible, if the restriction to obtaining or retaining better employment, is due to the disabilities.

Other guides and factors considered are physical, mental, or personality defects of a congenital or developmental nature — which may be a partial cause of the unemployability, will not preclude favorable rating.

To become eligible under this law requires a minimum of 90 days service, honorable discharge, an annual income not to exceed \$1000 a year if single, or \$2500 a year if married or has a minor child. The monthly rate is \$60 which is increased to \$73 after 10 years or when the veteran reaches the age of 65.
