I WRITE as I See It!

"In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. The same was in the beginning with God. All things were made by him; and without him was not anything made that was made. In him was life and the life was the light of men. And the light shineth in darkness; and the darkness comprehendeth it not. This is the true light which lighteth every man that cometh into the world. He was in the world, and the world was made by him, and the world knew him not. He came unto his own, and his own received him not. But as many as received him, to them gave he power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on his name." John 1:1-5, 9-12.

Again in John 17:5 we have the following from the lips of Christ himself: "And now, O Father, glorify thou me with thine own self with the glory which I had with thee before the world was."

Paul affirms these Scriptures with the following: "For by him all things created, that are in heaven, and that are in earth, visible and invisible, whether they be thrones, or dominions, or principalities, or powers: All things were created by him and for him." Colossians 1:16.

Before the world was created, Christ led the angelic army that expelled Lucifer from heaven, sometime later it was Christ that created this planetary system and peopled the earth with living beings. Later it was Christ that walked and talked with Adam and Eve in the garden of Eden and warned them against the designs of Lucifer. 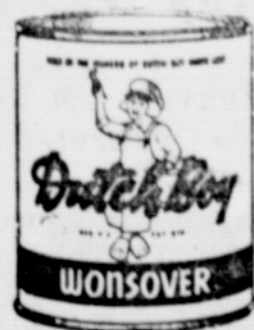
