

FLOWER SHOW SET FOR APRIL 6, AT SMITH RIVER

Plans Call For Affair To Be Biggest Event Of Entire Area

SMITH RIVER—A flower show which is expected to surpass anything ever held in this area, will be held Wednesday, April 6, at the Community hall, it was announced early this week by the Womens Club, sponsors of the event.

Under management of Mrs. Forrest Dunham, general chairman, proceeds from this event will be used entirely for expansion and maintenance of the local library, a project long fostered by the club.

With exhibitors from the local area, as well as from adjacent communities, extensive flower arrangements have been planned to include all flowers in bloom at the time. Plant sales also have been planned.

Another feature of the show is an Indian booth, which may contain many items of interest to everyone.

Art will also be recognized in arrangements as one room is being set aside for display of all talent which may wish to exhibit their work.

A style show has been arranged through a Eureka store, with the setting in a formal garden to be set on the stage.

Garden Clubs Invited

Garden clubs of both Del Norte and Curry counties are invited to participate in this show, each to arrange a booth or to enter in the general display. Contacts will be made before show time for such displays.

According to Mrs. Eunice Faris, president of the club, this exhibit is planned on big-scale ideas, and is expected to be made an annual affair.

Final Days Told By Bible Lecturer, At Chetco Inn, Sun.

"In the 20th chapter of Revelation God has drawn aside the curtain that veils the future and has clearly revealed to us the future history of the earth for the next 1000 years," stated Pastor Leo VanDolson of the Brookings Seventh-Day Adventist church, last Sunday night.

Sunday night's lecture was another in the current "Know-Your-Bible" series being presented at the Chetco Inn in Brookings.

"The popular view of the millennium," the lecturer continued, "is that it will be a time of peace and safety during which the whole world will be converted to Christianity. I wish that were true. But the Bible definitely reveals to us it isn't."

"Some of you seem surprised to learn that the Bible teaches that the wicked will live along with the righteous until the very day when Christ comes. That's what Jesus taught in the parable of the wheat and the tares which He said would grow together until the harvest which, according to His own words, is the end of the world.

"In fact Jesus taught in Matthew 24 that the nearer we come to the end of the world the more wicked man will become. He said that the end of the world would be just like the days before the flood.

"According to John 5:28-29, there are to be two resurrections, the resurrection of life and the resurrection of damnation. Revelation 20 indicates clearly that the first resurrection of life takes

place at the beginning of the millennium and the second resurrection of damnation takes place at the end of the millennium.

"The 1000-year period between these two resurrections is known as the millennium and during this period the earth will be a desolate waste according to such Bible texts as Rev. 20:1-3; Jer. 25:33; and Jer. 4:23-27.

"At the end of the millennium the second resurrection takes place as described in Rev. 20:12 at which time all the wicked who have ever lived on this earth will come forth from their graves for final judgment and are then destroyed in what John calls the 'second death.' Following this final destruction of sin and sinners God will create 'new earth' as eternal home for the righteous."

Cemetery Ansn. Get Deed To Land

At a meeting of the board of directors of the William James Ward Memorial Cemetery Association, held last week, a deed to the local cemetery was received from Bernice M. Ward, widow of the late W. J. Ward.

The tract of land conveyed as a gift to the association, representative of the whole community. The association, formed a year ago, is a non-profit incorporation, and all money received from the sale of lots will be used for the improvement of and the addition to the present site.

Since it was set aside in 1936 as a private burial plot, many families have made use of it and at present 60 persons have been buried there.

directors was the approval of the platting of the west half which had not been done before. A committee was appointed to formulate rules and regulations to govern the operation of the cemetery with regard to markers and care of the graves.
