SMITH RIVER—Following an illness of several years, suffering from a heart ailment, death summoned Oscar S. Brown, of this place, March 16, at Seaside hospital.

Funeral services were held on Friday afternoon from Wier's chapel, Crescent City, with Rev. E. C. Hicks officiating. Hymns: "The Old Rugged Cross," and "In the Garden" were sung by Billie Endert, accompanied by Millie Barker.

Mr. Brown was born in Missouri, Oct. 6, 1883, where he spent his younger life, coming to Los Angeles where he was engaged in oil drilling. Moving with his family, he came to Del Norte county in 1928 where he was employed in rock drilling. For the past six years he has lived at Smith River, where he has been prominent in fishing business and guide for the many fishermen on Smith River.

Surviving are his widow, Mabel of Smith River, a daughter, Mrs. Myrtle Horn of Crescent City, a son, Robert of Harbor, a niece, Fay Loomis of Los Angeles, and five grandchildren, Jackie and Betty Jane Horn, Dawn, Michelle and Rodney Browne.

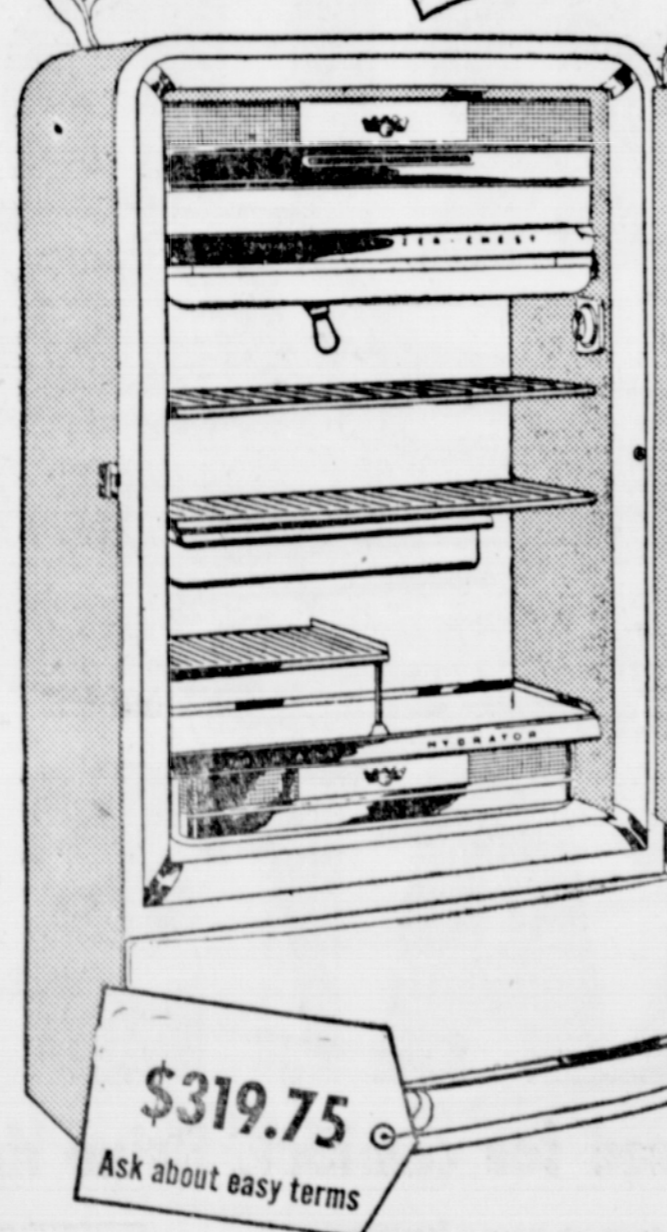
Mrs. Fred Smith left the first of the week for a two weeks visit at her former home at Seattle.

Mr. and Mrs. R. N. Nehrbus have moved to Crescent City to make their home.

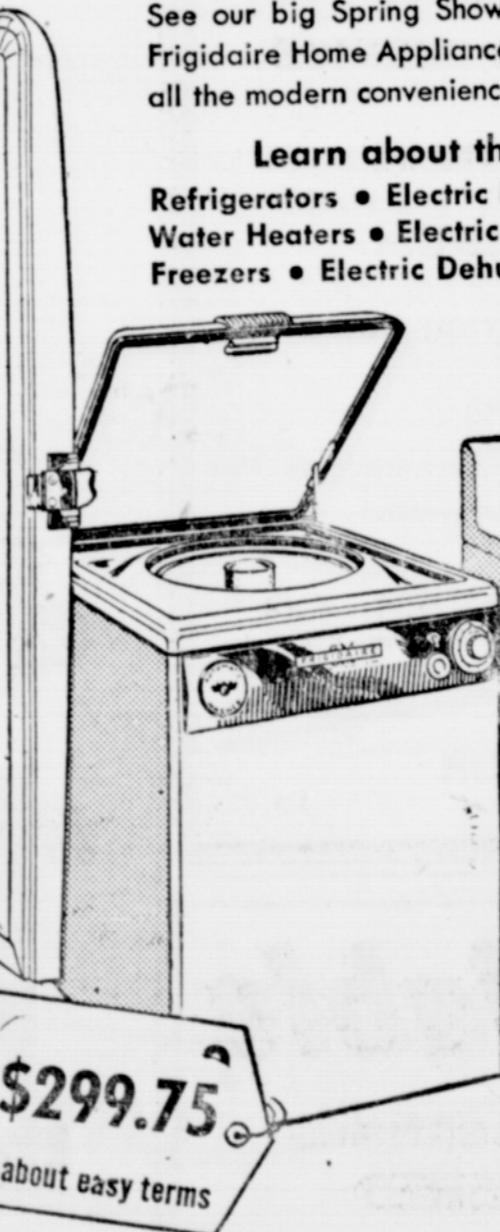

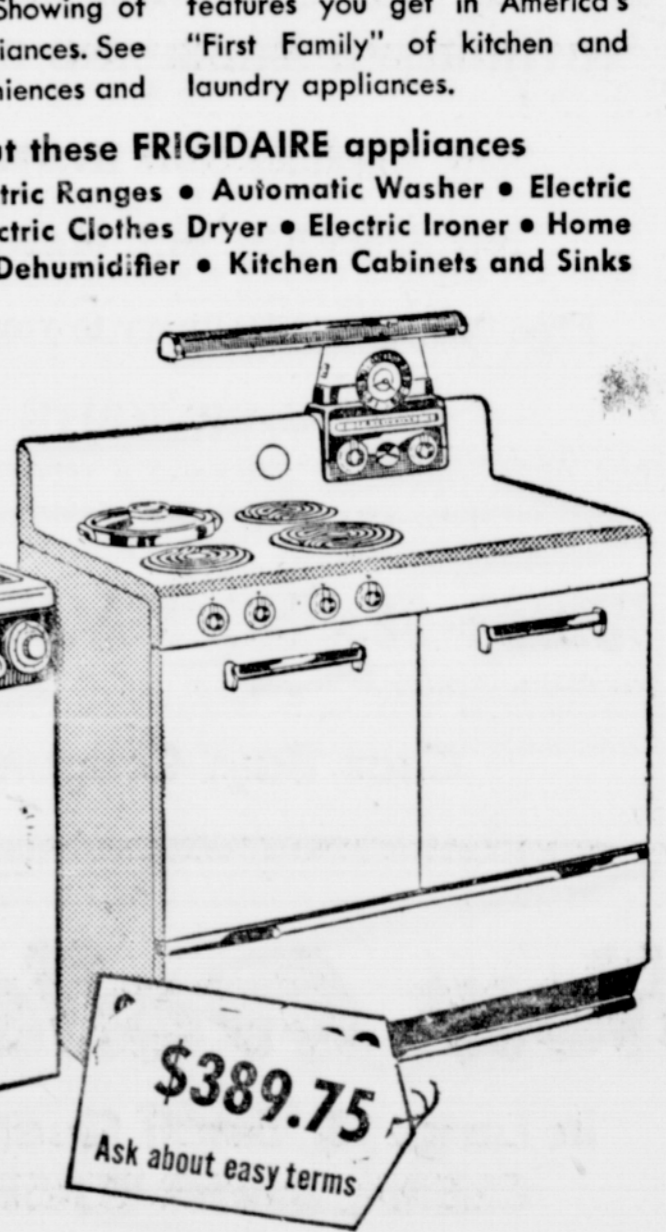
