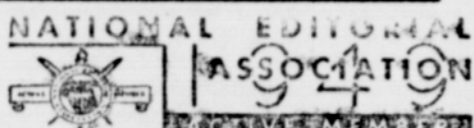
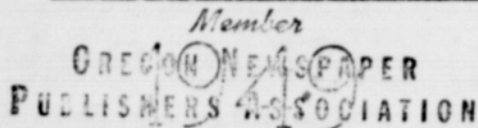

Her two children, a daughter, Clara, died in infancy, and son, Charles, was killed here in 1935. Her two sisters, Mrs. Anna Foster and Mrs. Rose Hight preceded her in death.
