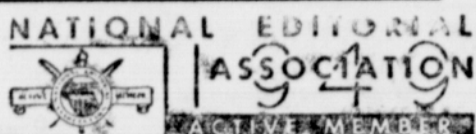
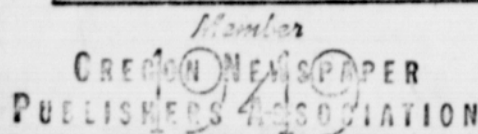

At Azalea State Park, the realm of Oregon's Azalea land, Saturday, May 21, and again Sunday, May 22, southwest Oregon will again observe the Azalea Festival, which has become, by tradition, a much anticipated event to everyone. Are you planning to be there?

America is blessed with but few places where azaleas grow wild. Brookings is one of these places, and Oregon recognizes the fact to the point where it includes pictures of Azalea State Park in its advertising folders and literature.
