

Gearin's Car Hits Bank In Accident

When something happened to the left front spring of his Jeep last Wednesday, Hugh Gearin, district attorney, suddenly found himself in the ditch, near Raymond's lodge.

Hugh suffered a gash across his forehead, his spectacles cut his eyebrow, but otherwise he was unhurt.

While it happened so quickly he had no chance to stop, Hugh did consider himself lucky to escape with as few cuts as he did. This is the third accident he has had with that Jeep, once when a Greyhound bus "clipped" him on a curve, another time at Coos Bay when he was tipped over as another car came into an intersection he was crossing.

Aside from his decoration of bandages Hugh looked not much worse for the experience.

County Hospital Assn. Will Not Use Federal Moneys

Curry county apparently does not want to go any further with federal aid in building a hospital.

According to an article in the weekly Reporter, of Gold Beach, the directorate, at their last meeting, was asked to pursue a course independent of the government program, believing the red tape tied to the national plan not only unadaptable to the economic setup of the county but that a suitable institution can be acquired independently.

At a previous election the Curry county voters went overwhelmingly in favor of levying themselves for \$50,000 for a hospital. At that time the government proposed to contribute to this and make possible a \$100,000 plant. Later, the government doubled its estimate which would require the county to raise \$100,000, half by popular subscription and half by tax.

Federal architects came up with their idea: a 20-bed hospital for \$184,000, or \$9,200 per bed, for the bare building. From there they extended to equipping, landscaping, etc., to a total cost of \$235,000, or \$11,750 per bed. Beyond this the directorate foresaw

maintenance regulations extending far into the future.

The directorate is now asked to investigate building and equipping a suitable hospital without government moneys and to find out if the levy approved by the voters can be used for same. The association now has nearly \$25,000 in cash or pledges. Add to this the \$50,000 levy, and the total comes to \$75,000. Now that local confidence is hatching a fund of \$100,000 isn't out of reason, especially as the need is imperative.

This course establish the program more popularly because the people concerned believe that a serviceable facility can be used for far less than \$11,000, or more, per bed, with subsequent maintenance and management in the hands of those most concerned and not dictated to by multiplicity of bureaus, far away.

The present directorate consists of Dr. R. L. Erickson, C. E. Seger and Earl Foster, Gold Beach; and E. E. Hanscam of Harbor. A northern Curry county member is yet to be named.
