School Budget Needs Your Support

To meet the amount of the budget necessary for proper conduct of schools in District No. 17, next Monday voters of this district will cast their ballots to raise \$15,731.70, that amount deleted from the district's budget by the Rural School Board.

There isn't much choice in the matter for District No. 17 if it wishes to be rated as a standard school by the state department of education. The vote must be affirmative, without doubt.

Two years ago when the district was torn by budget elections, the state department's attention was focused on the district—and an ultimatum was issued to the district. Sixty-five separate items were included on the list. This budget barely covers these necessary items—there will be none to spare.

Growing out of the controversy over the local schools was a consciousness of the actual conditions. People in the district today know that the present condition is not sufficient—that the schools need to be improved—and that quickly.

Your "Yes" vote next Monday will mean that District 17 may become standard instead of just being "conditionally standard," the status of the past year.
