

Forest Grove Plans Centennial Event For Sept. 19 to 25

FOREST GROVE — A mammoth 16-scene historical pageant, requiring a cast of 300 to 400 persons, will be featured attraction during Centennial Week scheduled for Sept. 19 to 25, according to Frank C. Broderson, president of Centennial Inc., a non-profit organization formed to celebrate the 100th anniversary of Pacific University and the Forest Grove section of the Tualatin plains.

The gigantic Centennial production will be presented on a 175-foot stage with hundreds of props including horses, wagons, and 300 appropriate costumes especially brought in from Hollywood.

Community organizations and social clubs have an opportunity to participate in the pageant through a cast auction plan in which various local groups will provide the principals for each of the show's 16 scenes. Adults and children alike, will be called upon to take part in this ambitious civic project designed and dedicated to Living and Learning—the community and the university—together through these past 100 years.

Selection of a Centennial Queen to rule over the anniversary celebration is expected to stimulate a great deal of interest and enthusiasm throughout the entire Tualatin Plains area. Complete details regarding method of selecting the queen and court will be announced early this summer.

(Veterans Homesteads)

More than 12,000 acres of irrigable public land comprising 104 farm units are being opened to homestead entry in Wyoming by the federal bureau of reclamation, with preference going to veterans of World War 2, the Oregon Department of Veterans Affairs stated this week.

Applications must be filed by July 12 with the Superintendent, Shoshone Project, bureau of reclamation, Box 900, Cody, Wyo. Application blanks and detailed instructions may be obtained from the same agency, by requesting Shoshone project notice No. 58.

One hundred of the homesteads are near Ralston, which is six miles from Powell and 20 miles from Cody on Wyoming Highway No. 14. The other four are three miles north of Cody.

The lands are described as raw, with about one-third covered with sagebrush and the remainder with native grasses. Soils, the reclamation bureau says, consists primarily of sandy loam underlaid with gravel.

"Adaptable crops," according to the bureau, "include alfalfa, clover, wheat, barley, oats, beans, peas, potatoes and sugar beets. Legumes are recommended as crops for the first few years. Cattle, sheep-raising and dairying are important industries, and hogs and poultry do well. Applicants must have \$3000 in cash, assets or farm equipment, two years of farming experience, good health, character references and must intend to farm as an occupation.

This will be the third homestead opening in what is known as the Heart Mountain division of the Shoshone reclamation project. There have already been 102 veterans of World War 2 settled on adjoining farm units offered by the government since the war.
