### All Fruits Are Not Barred By Calif. Inspection Stations

According to J. E. VanZee, of the quarantine station at the California state line, travelers entering California through the plant inspection stations may take with them unlimited quantities of fresh Oregon grown cherries, provided the fruit originated in an Oregon county free from cherry fruit fly, and the traveler has a certificate issued by the Oregon

department of agriculture substantiating the fact.

"Many travelers who arrive at our plant inspection stations are of the impression that all fresh fruits, vegetables and plants will not be taken from them as they cross into California. That impression is not correct. In fact, only those commodities which would spread in California insect pests or plant diseases are excluded," Mr. VanZee pointed out.
