

Butte Falls Smothers Pelicans, 18 To 4, To Show Locals How Defeat Feels, Sun.

Brookings Pelicans fell from the undefeated ranks of Rogue Valley league play at Butte Falls, Sunday, and took a real shellacking doing so. The sad news: Butte Falls, 18; Pelicans, 4.

The Pels got off to a good start with two runs in the first inning but the valley team immediately countered with three runs. Salvage, starting pitcher for Brookings, seemed to be over his rough

first inning start when he retired the Butte Falls boys, one-two-three in the second. However, the hosts got to him in the third for three straight hits and then another single after two intervening outs, good for three runs. Don Ackley, new relief pitcher and first baseman, then took over and retired the next batter.

Butte Falls scored two more tallies in the fourth, another in the fifth and then chased Ackley to the showers with four runs in the sixth. Four Pelican errors in this inning contributed to his downfall.

Manager Babe Swearingen put an end to the enemy scoring until the eighth when the final five runs crossed the plate.

Meanwhile, Welte, Butte Falls fast-ball pitcher, kept Pelican hits pretty well scattered, permitting only single runs in the seventh and ninth. He also had his "whiff" ball working, setting down 14 batters by strike-outs.

Matson and Mendenhall did not seem to be bothered with this "better-than-the-average pitcher,"

each came up with four hits in five trips to the plate.

A muddy infield and wet outfield grade made good baseball play practically impossible but the Pelicans are not making alibis. They are now determined to get back at the top of the league standing when they meet Rogue River in a game here Sunday afternoon.

Cave Junction defeated Rogue River 9 to 4 Sunday, giving them the league lead with three wins and one loss. Brookings and Butte Falls are tied for second with two victories and one defeat.
