

EAGLE POINT 3rd VICTIM FOR 'PEL' SLUGGERS, SUN.

Pelicans Made Hits Count To Top Visitors In Free-Hitting Game

Brookings Pelicans emerged as winners, Sunday, in their fourth league game against Eagle Point, but it took plenty of luck to accomplish the feat. After spitting Eagle Point two runs in the first inning, Brookings lashed out in the second for five runs, which Eagle Point saw getting bigger by the inning until the eighth, when they rose up with three runs for themselves.

Although Eagle Point nicked Dick Salvage for 15 safeties and six runs, their effort fell far below their expectations when they had 15 left stranded on bases. The Pelicans, on the other hand, hit safely 11 times, but made them accomplish something in many instances.

With four hits in four trips to the plate, Whitey Matson lead all hitters. He was walked the fifth time to prevent him from doing damage. The hit that really counted heavies was the solid two-ply smash delivered by Val Mendenhall, in the second inning with the bases loaded.

Eagle Point's eighth-inning uprising was touched off by Belleck's home run, followed soon afterwards by Perry's homerun with a mate aboard. The ball rolled to the school house.

Swearingen relieved Salvage and stopped the fire with no more damage than a tied score.

Brookings came back in her half of the eighth to score what proved to be the winning run with Matson singling after Swearingen was out. He was forced at second on Spangler's infield fly. Mendenhall advanced Spangler to third on a single. Spangler scored when Hanscam's grounder went through shortstop's legs.

An error and a walk put Eagle Point baserunners on in the first of the ninth, with the heavy hitters coming up, including Belleck who smashed a home run his first trip. He grounded, pitcher to first after Swearingen had kept the runner at third. The next two hit easy rollers to retire the side after they had runners on second and third. The box score:
