There have been times, Pilot readers, when I had my doubts concerning the good accomplished by these various functions. That was before I had opportunity to visit and talk to people from a number of places. Just three weeks ago I had all doubt removed.

Actually, I learned conclusively on July 17, that many communities coveted this area's ability and resources to stage these functions. Doubt that statement? I'd suggest that you take a trip up the coast, stop occasionally at a few places, say, restaurants, and casually remark that you're a resident of this area, then see if you can't learn something about yourself, and what other people think of the area.

Too many of us want to see immediate results for an effort we may put forth. Life, evidently

doesn't work just that way. Good will and praise come through a long and slow process. Noticeable, and don't you forget it, is evidences of community effort at any event, such as Rose Festival parade, Pirate celebration or any event you choose to study.

Formation of some kind of association where everyone in this community has an interest, even if it's but a dollar, will mean more, perhaps than the dollar can actually buy. There will be a different spirit, and don't forget that visitors notice it, that will cause the visitor to actually thaw out and be friendly.

One of the prize-winning floats in the Grants Pass Glad Show was patterned after the Brookings Water Co. float, it is told. The firm building this float made overtures to Mr. Bankus asking for the framework of his sweep-stake winner.
