He is believed to have fallen from his motor boat several miles up the river from Klamath Glen on Friday evening. No one saw him fall from the boat as he was alone at the time. The boat was found later. The body was recovered Monday afternoon, floating in the water. The body is at Wier Mortuary, pending funeral arrangements. Brooks was a native of Klamath and received a Carnegie medal several years ago for saving two people in the Klamath River.

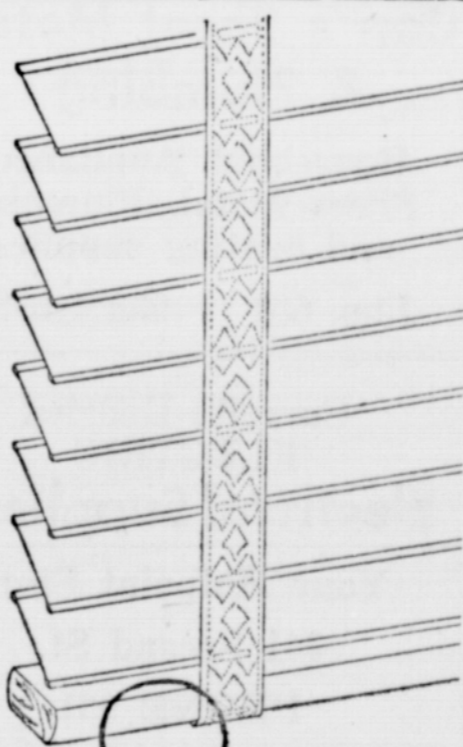
