

Electricians Needed At Grand Coulee

Examination for probational appointments to the positions of electrician (general); electrician (power plant equipment installation); electrician (cable and conduit installation) and electrician helper, at wages ranging from \$1.14 an hour to \$2.28 an hour were announced this week by the board of U. S. Civil Service Examiners, Coulee Dam, Wash., to fill existing and future vacancies in these positions in various federal government agencies in Region 1 of the U. S. Bureau of Reclamation. (This area includes states of Washington and Idaho and portions of Oregon and Montana).

To qualify in these examinations, competitors will not be required to report for a written examination, but will be rated on the extent and quality of their experience and training as outlined on their application forms. Minimum requirements for the journeymen electrician positions include the completion of four-year apprenticeship, or four years experience in the trade. Included within this four-year period, or, in addition thereto, applicants must have at least one year's experience in the type of position

ices are under the direction of Gilbert Christensen and assisted by Alice Overman.

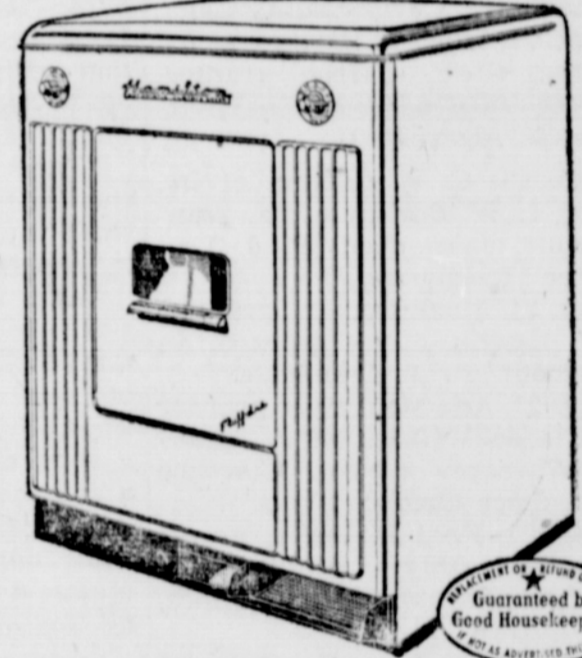
