She also showed a colored slide of the Trinidad light house, which has been taken over by the Humboldt County federation, as a memorial.

A resolution was presented by Mrs. Ralph Liuck for the support of the California federation of womens club prevailing on congress to keep the Crescent City light house intact as a memorial and preserve its log book in the county. The resolution suggests the light house is threatened with abandonment, but the women are anxious to keep it either as a museum or as an operative light huose. This light was established in 1856, and has been in use ever since.

Members of Chetco Grange are reminded that there will be a pot luck dinner at 6:30 this Friday evening before the meeting,

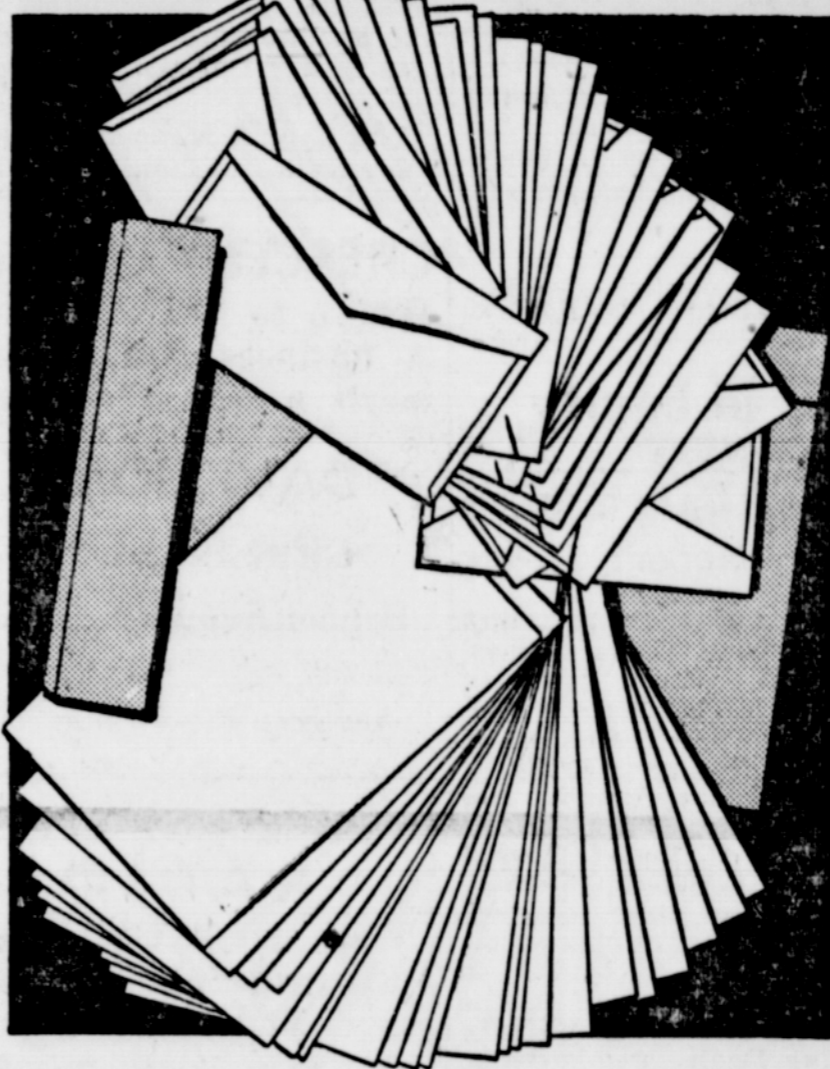
and that a social time will be held after a short meeting, in honor of Mr. and Mrs. Wm. Tolman, recent newlyweds.
