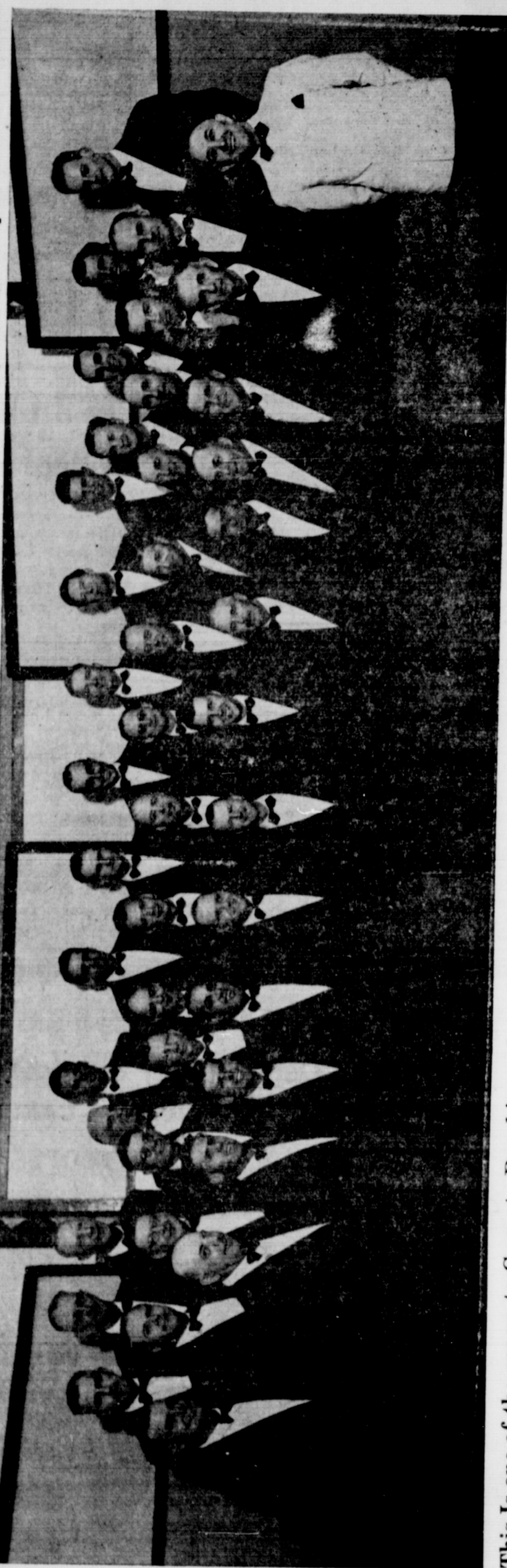


Klamath Falls Chorus of 40-odd Voices Coming Here, Saturday, For "Cavalcade of Harmony" Festivities!
