

WM. R. MANION NAMED HEAD OF OREGON COAST ASSOCIATION

Oregon Coast Association's 19th annual convention, which concluded at Crescent City last Tuesday, saw some 200 Oregon Coast boosters, gathered in business sessions seeking further highway improvements through its vacationland area; repeal of the 15% travel tax; standardization of cottage rates and election of Wm. R. Manion, Seaside realtor, as its president for the coming year.

The association's actions urged that a causeway be built between Tillamook and Bay City, Ore., immediately north of the Kilchis river, to raise the roadway above the highway mark of floods which occur periodically each year.

It is urged the straightening of alignment of U. S. Highway 101 from Bay City north to Garibaldi.

Supported also were sportsmen organizations programs seeking further conservation and development of wild life along the Oregon coast.

The association accepted recommendation committee's proposal to study the advantages and disadvantages of locating the association's office south of Crescent City on Highway 101.

The association also planned county meetings to be held three to four times a year and a spring conference of the board of directors to be held at Sherwood Lodge, Yachats, during the early part of the year.

Manion, who succeeds H. A. Sanders of Smith River, as president, is a Seaside realtor and owner of the Seaside-Gearhart Land Co. He joined the Oregon Coast Association in 1945 and has served as director and vice-president and in August of this year was appointed secretary to fill the vacancy left by the resignation of John Aschim.

K. Willer, Newport, Axel Johnson, Waldport and Orville Cox, Oceanlake; Lane county, Al Greer, Florence; Douglas county, Fred Judges, Gardiner, E. L. Tolman and Claude Sanders Winchester Bay; Coos county, George McBride and Clayton Driscoll, Coos Bay; Bob Thompson, Coquille; Curry county, M. E. Kelley, Port Orford and P. J. Lesmeister, Brookings; Del Norte county, James S. Hight, Kenneth Crabb and H. A. Sanders.

Association delegates heard a discussion on the highway situation in Oregon by Ralph T. Moore, chairman of the legislative interim committee.

Manley F. Robinson, director, Travel Department, Oregon State Highway Commission, talked on the tourist picture and Secretary of the State of Oregon, Earl T. Newbry, spoke on the branch offices of his office to be established on Hwy 101, on the Oregon coast. These offices, Mr. Newbry stated are to be located at Coos Bay, Tillamook, Astoria and one in Lincoln county, to assist the resident and tourist. Road information and literature will be given out to encourage the tourist to spend more time in the area.
