Supreme court of the State of Washington in November ruled the World War 2 veterans' bonus act constitutional. Bonus will pay \$10 for each month of domestic duty and \$15 per mo. of foreign duty, with no maximum.

Since service must have been between Dec. 7, 1941, and Sept. 2, 1945, it is possible for a veteran to receive up to \$675 if his 45 months of service was overseas. He must have been a resident of Washington for at least one year immediately prior to entering service.

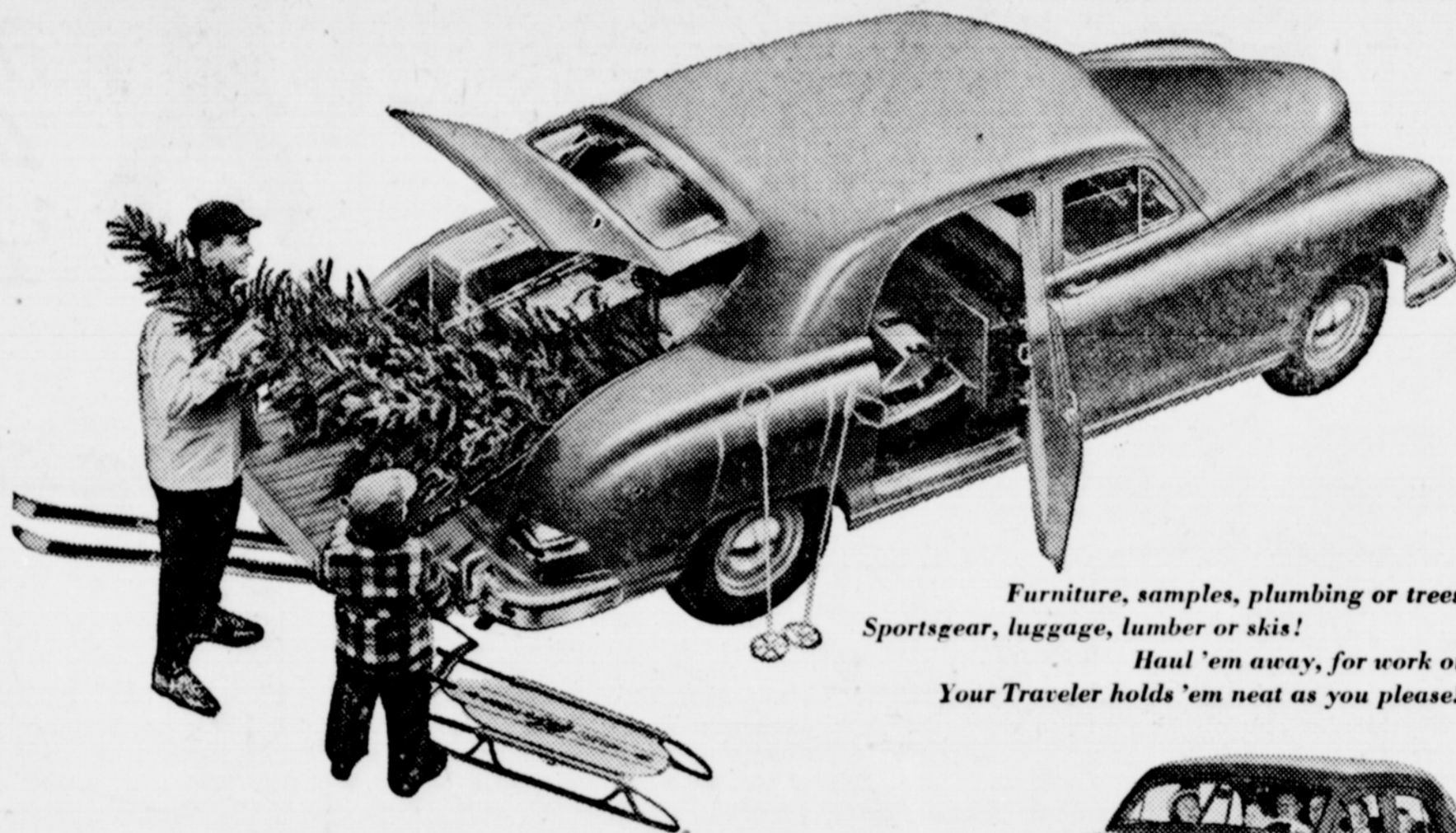
Present information indicates that there is no deadline for applying, and further, that there is no minimum-service requirement. The act becomes effective Nov. 28, 1949, but it will be

some time before application forms are available and payments start. Next of kin of deceased veterans will be eligible, but provisions for this group have not been announced.

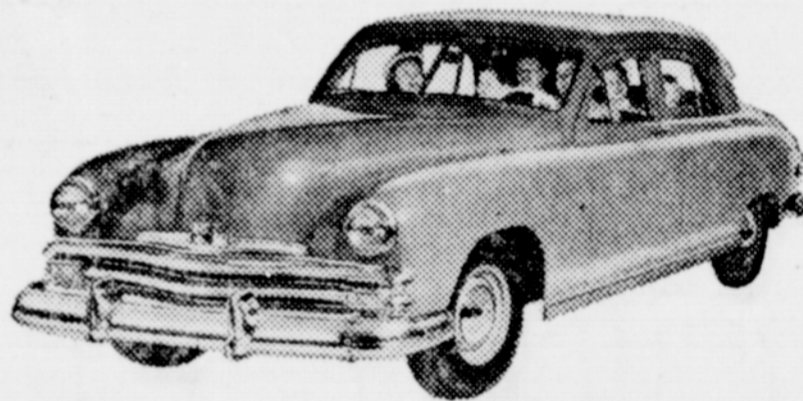
Application forms will be furnished by your county service officer and the department of veterans affairs when available. Administering agency is the bonus division, state auditor, Olympia, Wash. Your county service officer, upon receipt of application forms, will notify you in these columns.

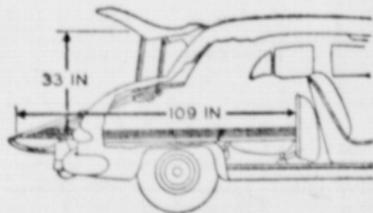
