C. H. Stapleton, formerly of the Harbor area, but now of Crescent City, was in the area Tuesday seeking business for the new well-drilling concern he is heading.

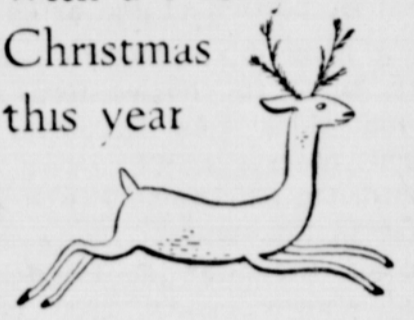
