

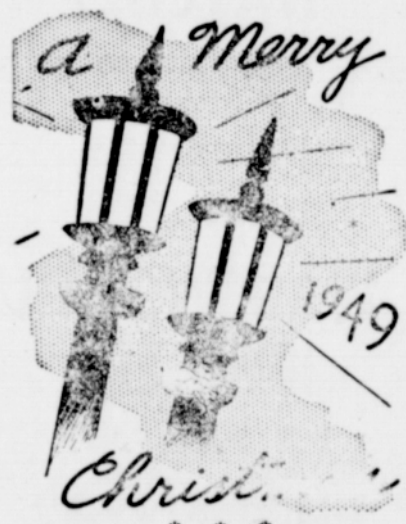
Del Norte Had A Game To Win Over Stubborn Bruins

Kenneth C. Thompson, newly-appointed manager, will attend the state directors and managers meeting at Portland on January 5 to 7.

The next meeting will be held in the evening of Jan. 16 to take appropriate action on recommendations of the cattle association which meets for an all-day session the same day.
