

## DIMES DRIVE TO BEGIN NEXT MON. OVER NATION

**GOLD BEACH** — Opening of the 1950 March of Dimes campaign begins in Curry County and throughout the nation on Monday, Jan. 16, John Porisch, Curry county director, announced late last week. The following community chairmen have been appointed to aid:

Curry county was again fortunate in that no new case of infantile paralysis occurred in the past year. However, in the nation, the number of cases has reached an all-time high, with more than 41,000. This far exceeds the previous record occurrence of 27,000 in 1916.

Over eight per cent of the victims received aid from the National Foundation of Infantile Paralysis. Total expenditures for medical aid was thirty-one million dollars. Of this amount the national headquarters supplied almost ten million to county chapters whose funds were exhausted.

Since its beginning in 1938, the National Foundation through the March of Dimes has been able to provide the best available medical care for every victim stricken. The record 1949 epidemic has exhausted the national headquarters funds as well as many county chapter funds in 44 states. If this work of providing help to every victim, the 1950 drive must be the greatest ever, stated Mr. Porisch to the press.

Curry county and the State of Oregon have always been known as outstanding contributors to the campaign. Last year Oregon ranked fourth in United States on a per-capita basis. Curry was 17th in the 36 Oregon counties.

Workers are again confident that Curry citizens will meet the quota for the county, and exceed it, if possible.

### Road Load Limit Slows Trucking In Entire State

With highway load limits cut as much as 50 per cent in many sections of the state, trucking in the local area took a decided drop late last week, when the state highway commission, due to winter conditions, reduced the load limits all over Oregon.

In the higher elevations frosts have weakened pavements, and along the coast the rains have softened the fills under many pavements. Restrictions will be lifted only when these winter conditions are relieved.

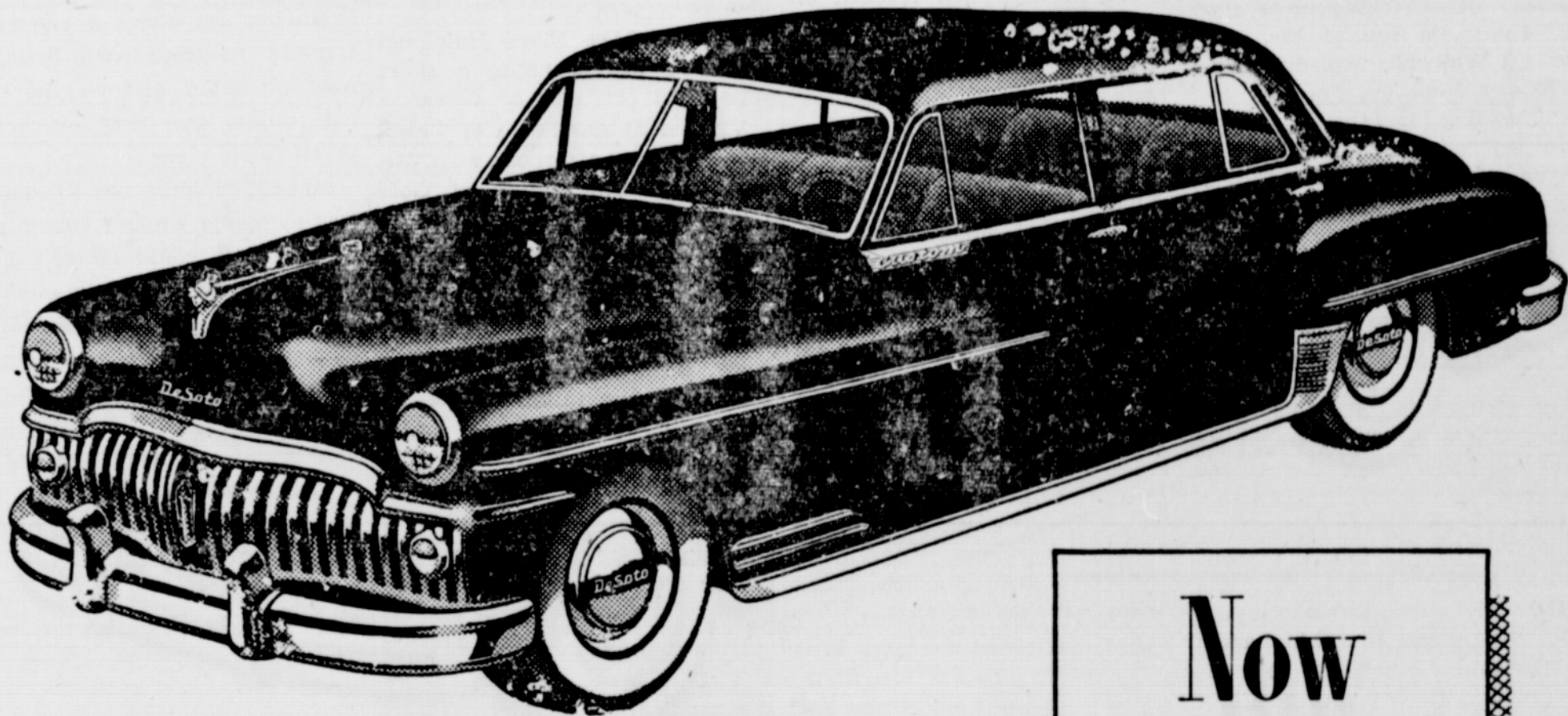
