States now paying a veterans bonus: Alaska, Connecticut, Hawaii, Illinois, Indiana, Louisiana, Iowa, Massachusetts, Michigan, Minnesota, New Hampshire, New York, North Dakota, Ohio, Rhode Island, South Dakota, Vermont, Washington.

Your county service officer will gladly furnish detailed data, as requirements, amounts and proper address where to obtain bonus forms to any veteran or their dependents, eligible to bonuses, of the above named states.

Bonus forms for the states of Washington, Minnesota, New York, North Dakota, and Pennsylvania are available at the veterans service office.

Also on hand are prisoner of war forms, which are also payable to survivors of deceased prisoners of war, which include widow, dependent husband, children, or dependent parents, if there is no widow or children.

Others entitled to prisoners of war benefits according to the department of Oregon veterans'

affairs, are: civilian internees, over 18 may receive \$60. in detention benefits for each month of internment by the Japanese, those under 18 years of age will receive \$25 for each month.

Civilian internees may obtain blanks from the state adjutant general, state office building, at Salem. Your county service officer will gladly assist in obtaining and filing for any of the above named state bonuses, or prisoners of war benefits. Call 343, or write for desired information.

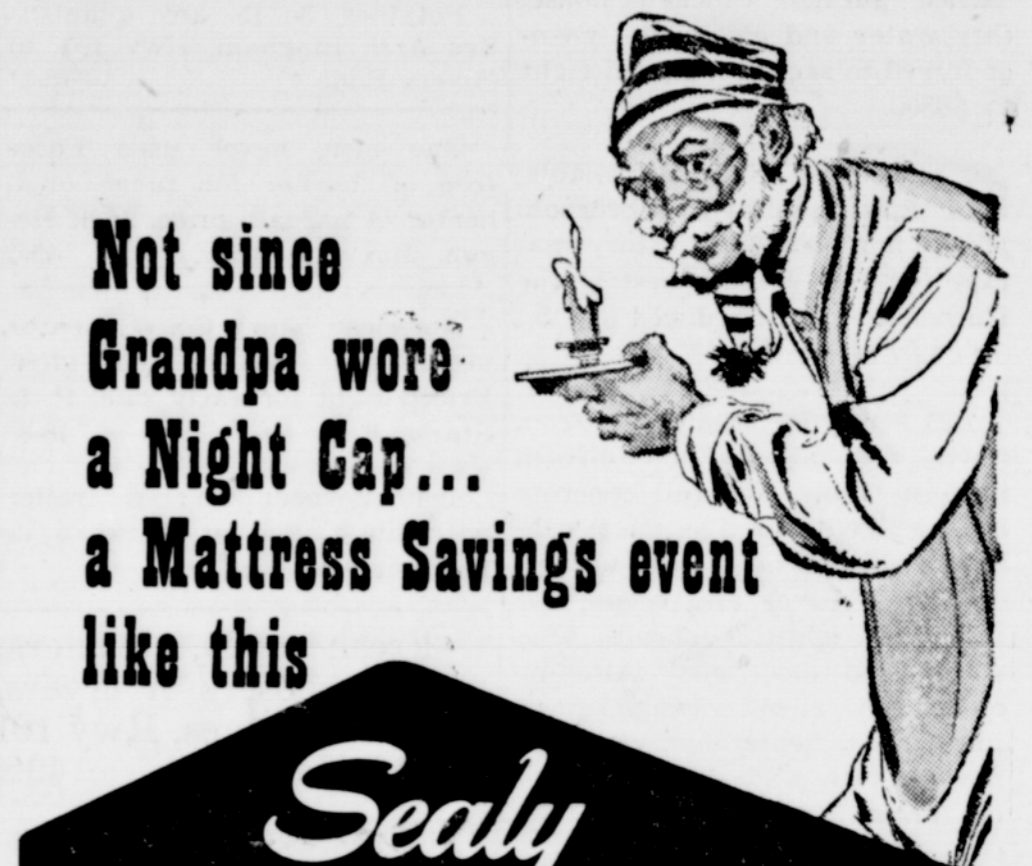
