

Former Actress Buried Here, Sat.; Here Three Years

Funeral services were held at Baptist Community Church, Saturday afternoon for Mrs. Willistine Lorraine Gallagher, 50, resident of this area about three years, who died at her home, on the Gardner tract, about 2 miles up the Chetco, late last Wednesday evening. Death was reported to have been caused by a heart attack brought on by high blood pressure. Rev Nick Neufeld officiated both at the church and at the cemetery.

During the days of silent pictures, both Mrs. Gallagher and her husband were once identified with Mack Sennett's comedies.

Born at Chicago, August 6, 1900, she was 50 years, 6 months and 20 days old. Surviving are her husband, Raymond of this place and a son, Newton Young of Los Angeles.

Had A Close Call After Fall Into Lake

PORT ORFORD—Marvin Cooley had a narrow escape last week when he lost his balance and fell into Garrison Lake from his speed boat in which he was riding alone. The boat narrowly missed him as he started to struggle ashore with heavy clothing and boots on.

Jerry Studley and Blaine Marsh started out after him but he waved them back, figuring he could make it alone. After 20 minutes in the icy water, he finally made it to a log just off shore, near the Livermore place where he passed out as the other men pulled him out and administered artificial respiration. He was suffering from severe shock so they rushed him home where he was put under blankets and hot water bottles until he regained consciousness, several hours later.

The boat raced around the lake unguided for an hour or so, until it ran out of gas. Several times it charged up to the dock or to a stationary log in the middle of the lake, only to turn in a nick of time to miss the obstacles.

Mr. Cooley is back at work, seemingly none the worse for his harrowing experience.
