

SMITH RIVER

Second attempt to put the 156-foot yacht in the mouth of Smith River was successful Saturday at high tide, when the tug Prospector, skippered by Capt. Oscar Huffman of Soggswell Launch Co., Eureka, with the German-built yacht in tow, entered the mouth of the river. Wayne Blagdon, ith motor boat, accompanied by L. Henderson, a service station operator, at Fine Memorial bridge, went out to meet the tug and Henderson and went aboard the tug and piloted the tug with the yacht, through the mouth and anchored the ship in Smith River where it will be pulled to the bank, where Joe Sierka has re-christened it the S. S. Castle Rock, and will rebuild with rooms on deck, and convert into a tourist resort. Hundreds of people from Oregon and Del Norte county lined the banks Saturday to watch the ship come through the mouth. Many pictures were taken. The first attempt to bring the boat into the river was made last August, but due to ground swells was not successful. The craft was then towed to Eureka. Bulldozers, under direction of Marvin Tryon, are at work now pulling the ship on the bank, its new and permanent location.

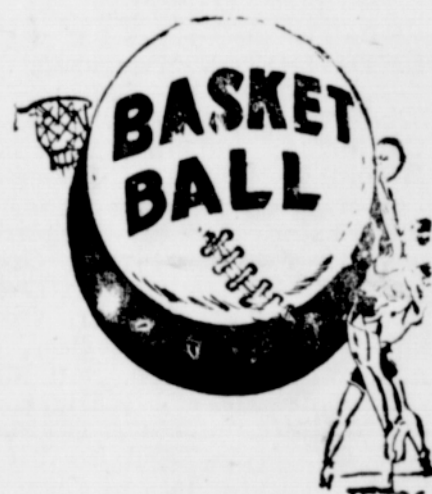
