## Power Line Bid Is Up For Approval

The bid of \$166,889.50 for construction of the 32.7 miles of 69kv transmission line, Gold Beach to the California line, was sent to the Rural Electrification Administration for approval, Bruce Shavere, general manager, told the Pilot late last week.

At opening of the bids at Coquille, only two bids were received: One from the Del Monte Construction Co. of Oakland, for \$166,889.50 and Larned Construction Co., for \$205,042.65.

The board of directors, on vote sent the Del Monte bid to the federal agency.

Favorable reply from Washington may assure early work on the line, connecting the last link of the co-operative chain of lines, to connect with the Bonneville line to be built to Gold Beach next year.
