Local Man Honored By State Associa'n

Wm. L. Crissey has been named as honorary vice-president of "Save the Myrtlewoods, Inc." as others were honored: V. V. Harp-ham of Roseburk, and Judge L. D. Felsheim of Coquille.

The biggest piece of unfinished business, according to Thornton Munger of Portland, who was re-elected president for 1950, is to save the small stands of myrtle-wood trees which lie within the big timber companies' domains.

Virgin myrtle is found nowhere else in the world and the few remaining stands of pure bottom-land myrtle type are now in the holdings of companies.

It is not the purpose of this group to purchase the land, nec-essarily, or to open it to visitors, but merely to see that it is not destroyed in the process of log-ging as has been the case at times in the past.

Save the Myrtlewoods Inc. has been successful in preserving sev-eral groves and tracts of virgin stands throug the generosity of Oregon Federation of Garden Clubs, Mrs. C. S. Jackson, the State Board of Forestry, the Bu-reau of Land Management of the U. S. Department of Interior and others co-operating.

The association has received total contributions amounting to \$16,664 and has a balance of \$3,196 for further purchases.

The Alfred E. Loeb State For-est park, near here was one of the parks purchased. William L. Crissey has been instrumental, through his far-sighted efforts in obtaining recognition by the pub-lic of the value of such myrtle-wood forest preserves.

Other officers elected were: first vice-president, M. L. Mer-rill, second vice-president, Her-man Boyer, treasurer, Milton Rice; corresponding secretary, Mrs. Theodore Adams and re-cording secretary, Mrs. E. J. Willard.

Water Main Break Floods Hardware Basement Stock

Another break in the water mains, which have plagued the Brookings Water Company much of the winter, occurred last Fri-day evening, near the Grayshel buildings, where it caused the sidewalk to sink several inches, and a flood in the basement at Chetco Home and Auto Supply Co. store.

Immediate action on part of the owners to remove much of the goods given a soaking, will reduce the damage, but much of the packaged goods were lost through the water damage.

The store is fearful that rust-ing, as in the case of nails in kegs, and of other metal goods, will result, even after precau-tions had been taken.

Heavy rains the past winter, and increased pressure result-ing from the amount of water, have caused no end of worry to the maintenance crew, which has put in many over-time hours since the first of the year.
