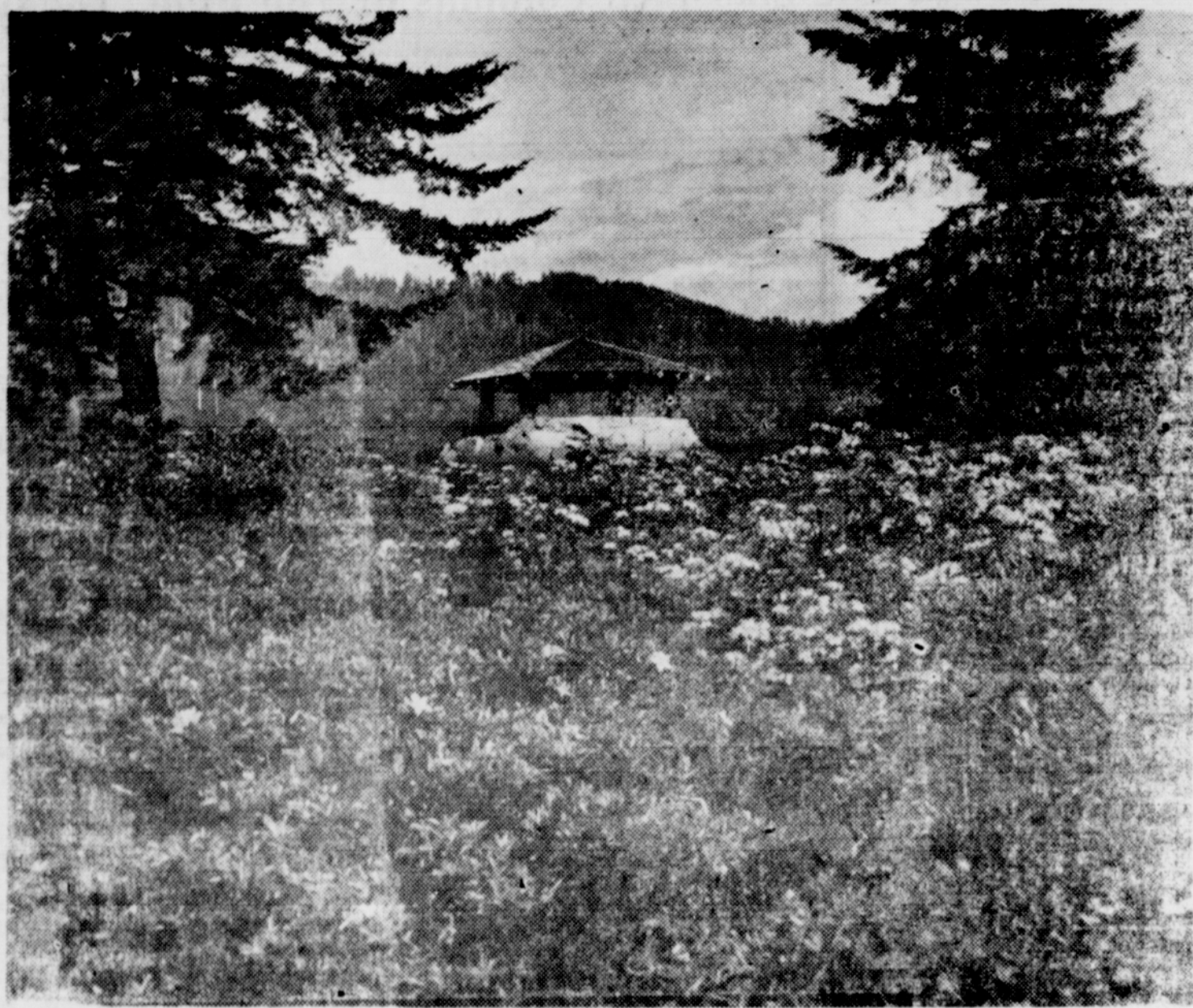


Scene To Be Viewed At Festivities, Saturday
