First: That the defendants be required to set forth their several and respective claims and alleged interest, title, right, estate or lien in or to the following described real estate, to-wit:

Parcel I. The South half (S½) of the Southwest Quarter (SW¼) of the Northwest Quarter (NW¼) of the Northwest quarter (NW¼) of the Southwest quarter (SW¼) of the Northwest quarter (NW¼) of Section Four, Township 41 South, Range 13 West of the Willamette Meridian. Except the following portion from the above described property: Beginning at the Northwest corner of the South half of the Southwest quarter of the Northwest quarter of the Northwest quarter of Section 4, Twp. 41 S., R. 13 west; thence east 580 feet; thence South 230 feet; thence West 580 feet; thence North 230 feet to the point of beginning.

Fifth: That plaintiffs have such other and further relief as the Court may deem equitable, including plaintiffs' cost and disbursements herein laid out and expended as to any appearing defendants.

King, Circuit Judge for Curry County, Oregon, which Order was signed, dated and entered May 2nd, 1950, directing publication to be made once a week for four successive and consecutive weeks. WHAT IS COMING?

There is more than \$27,000.00 included in the proposed 1950-51 budget for District No. 17 that is not needed whatever. There are still many items in the budget that could be reduced with no ill effect, such as the \$400.00 item for water.

There is about \$3,000.00 in tuition due the district and it is compulsory according to law that this be collected. As a matter of neglect, the school directors failed to collect this tuition annually. It stems from bringing five school children who reside in California with their parents into the Brookings School over a period of three years. The collection of this tuition due our school district is going to create a surplus in our district funds.

And don't think for a minute that you can increase your special district tax by \$11,335.00 over last year's special district tax and still have a lower tax bill than one you received a year ago. It just doesn't work out that way. And don't be fooled or misled by false figures.

The old line of bunk about a substandard school and the withholding of basic school support funds is nothing but mere propaganda emanating from a most unreliable source. At a meeting held in Medford, Oregon, on May 16, 1950, by the tax committee of State Legislature, it was brought out that the Superintendent of Public Instruction dare not withhold any of the basic school support funds from any school district in the state of Oregon. And if this this was done, the State Legislature would immediately trim the wings of those responsible for withholding basic school support funds.

Our bonded indebtedness amounts to \$152,000.00 including interest and the first payment on the bonds will be made in 1952 and the last payment in 1965.

A heavy tax load over a long period of years calls for a NO vote Wednesday evening to stop wholesale extravagance and waste of the district funds.

And beware of the smoke screens being put out in support of the overstuffed budget. VOTE NO.
