

### Grants Pass Takes Pelicans, Sunday, In 'Wild Melee'

Brookings rallied for a brace of runs, Sunday, in the top of the ninth, but fell one short of tying the score at Grants Pass. The 10 to 9 score set the Pelicans back for their fourth league defeat.

The heavy-hitting Grants Pass nine lashed out a total of 18 hits, 16 of which were at the expense of Lou Scrivens, ex-Willamette University hurler. In fairness to Lou it can be stated that he had pitched a 5-hitter for Oregon City only two days previous and had ridden all Saturday night along with Chuck Bafaro, new Pelican catcher, neither getting any sleep. Big Hank Westbrook relieved Scrivens with two down in the seventh, and retired the last hitter in that inning but ran into trouble in the bottom of the eighth when Grants Pass tallied the two final runs.

The Pels had an off-day in the hitting department, gathering but six bingles off the combined efforts of Rusty Martindale and Eddie McComas. Martindale was accorded poor support by his mates, none of the seven runs scored off him in six innings were earned.
