After Astin had whiffed Weaver, first man up, Lowrey got a scratch single past first base. Van Loo hit one to Matson at short and the perfect double-play ball went through him to allow the two runners to advance to third and second. They came in on a single by Standifer. Then Astin slammed the door for a time.

In their half of the first, the Pelicans scored when Holzgang teased a walk, stole second and came home on Matson's single. The Myrtle Creeks scored again in the third on a single, two passed balls after a steal of second base.

Brookings made a new game of it in the fourth when Holzgang got his second walk, stole second, came home on Matson's hit, and Matson came in on Barret's screeching double. This ended the scoring for a couple of innings, when the Pelicans' centerfielder allowed a single to trickled by him to allow two scores. An error by Jollie at first allowed a runner to reach second, and he scored on the throw in which hit him on the head.

The Pelicans evened the count in the seventh on Astin's triple, and a single. Behind in the eighth by one run, Hank Westbrook got to first on an error, reached second on a steal, and came home on McLean's long homer over the centerfielder's head. Barrett scored on Jollie's hit into right field, to stop the scoring. Myrtle Creek could do nothing with Astin in the ninth, who whiffed two and caused the other to pop out.
