The foregoing standings, fans will note, changed considerably over the week-end. The Pelicans, as was expected, were handed another win and a definite spot in the play-offs, when the Rogue River club forfeited their scheduled game with Brookings.

Myrtle Creek, previous third place club, dropped to sixth by forfeiting the two remaining games to Ashland and Central Point.

Central Point also gained two additional victories by downing Ashland 8 to 1 Saturday night and also defeating Crescent City 5 to 3 Sunday.

League Secretary J. Q. Adams advised Pete Lesmeister, business manager of the Pelicans that the Crescent City protest of the August 6 game with Ashland has been disallowed, thus giving Ashland a tie with Brookings for third and fourth places in the standings while knocking Crescent City out of the play-offs.

Roseburg and Central Point have a make-up game still unplayed. This is to be scheduled Wednesday of this week. A Roseburg win would throw these two clubs into a tie.

How the tie between Ashland and Brookings will be settled has not been determined but since the play-offs are scheduled to start next Sunday, this tie may be decided by the flip of a coin to see which club meets Central Point or Roseburg in the first

game of the single elimination post-season series.

The games may be played at the Medford Rogues' park at Medford, providing the professional team is on the road at the time.

Sunday, Sept. 3, will be the date for the finals, probably also to be played in the valley.

Brookings, after losing the first few games by heart-breaking scores, took on new life and toward the end of the season, resembled champions. No team had the luck to beat them twice in league play, except the Central Point team.

Arnold and Donald Carpenter received notice from the selective service and left last Thursday for Eugene, for their physical examinations.

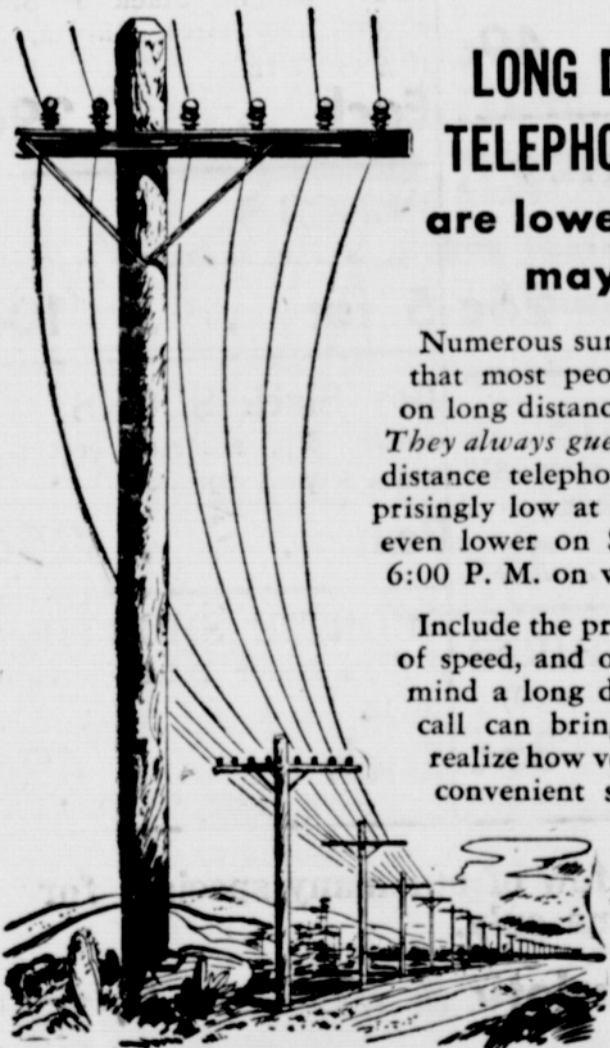
