Charles LaVern Mendenhall, aviation ordnance airman, who was graduated from Brookings high school in 1948, is now serving with the Seventh Fleet on a long range bomber, his parents informed the Pilot.

"Mendy" or LaVern, as most all his friends know him, enlisted in the naval air corps in the summer of 1948 and received his "boot" training at San Diego, later taking ordnance training at Memphis, Tenn., and then returning to San Diego where he was based with Patrol Squadron 46 for the past year.

It is believed that LaVern was the first one from this area to be called to active duty after the invasion of South Korea, for he left the states only three hours after the president gave the warning.

LaVern is the younger son of Mr. and Mrs. V. A. Mendenhall Sr., and brother of V. A. Mendenhall Jr. and Mrs. Ed Thornton. He was the first eagle scout in Curry County.
