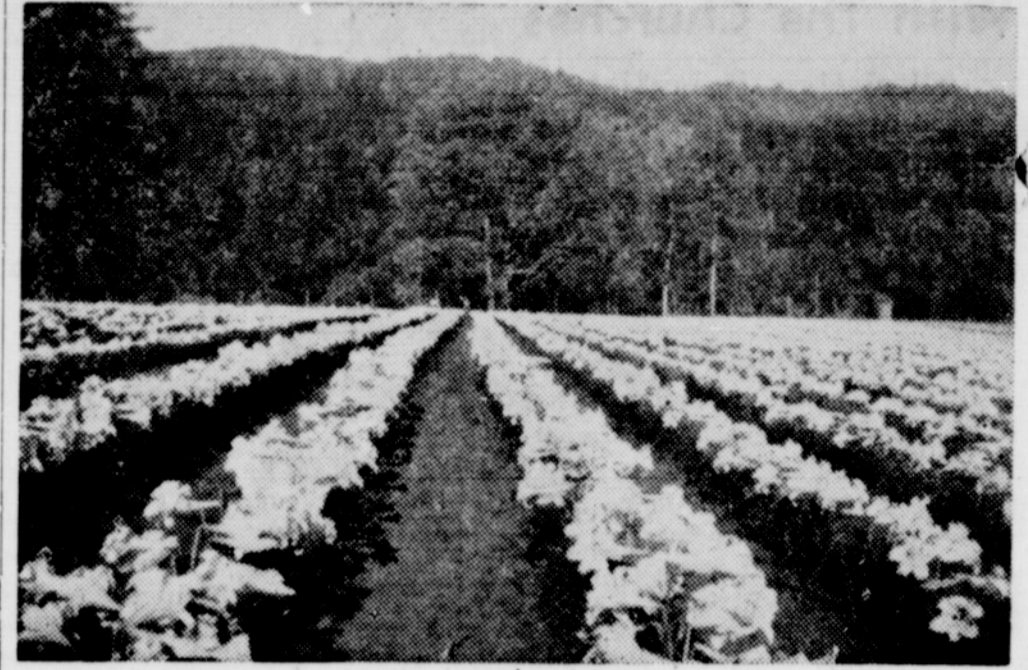


IT NEVER FAILS
