

CURRY COUNTY FAIR ACCLAIMED SUPERIOR TO PREVIOUS SHOWINGS

GOLD BEACH—Number and quality of the exhibits from all over the county exceeded those of any previous year, as the 1950 Curry County Fair and Rodeo was acclaimed best ever held since the fair was started years ago. 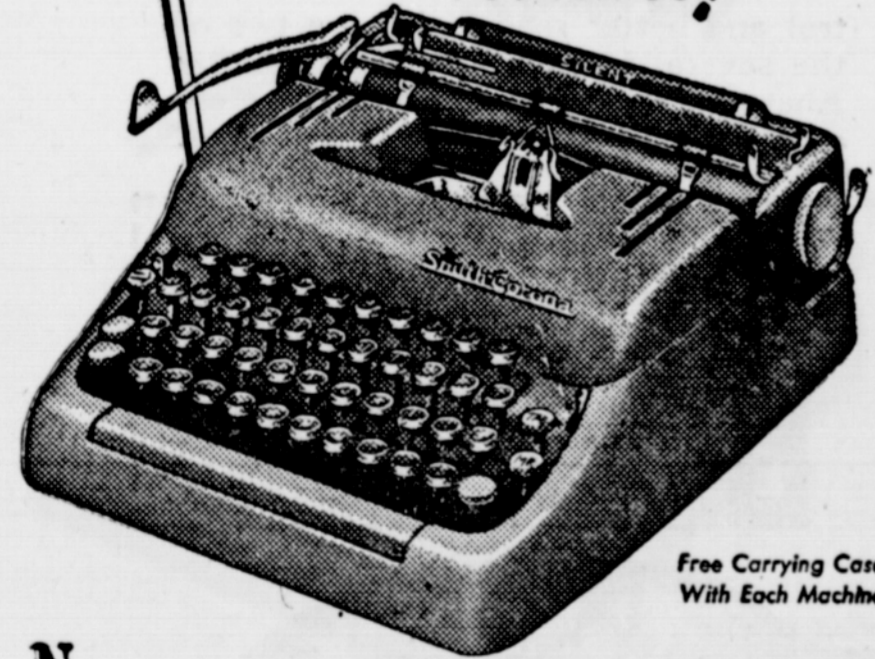

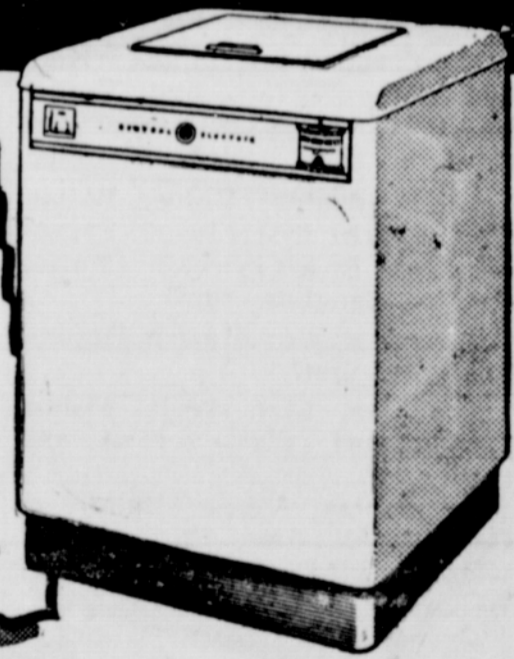
