

Canada Thistle Is Oregon No. 2 Weed For Eradication

GOLD BEACH—A serious Oregon noxious weed—the lowly Canada thistle—was once considered a valuable addition to the garden.

Authority for the statement is none other than Rex Warren of OSC. The farm crops specialist says the state's second-ranking weed threat was actually brought to Oregon by early-day settlers. They planted it in rows in their gardens and used a portion of the plant for bread baking. Jasper Yoakum, Langlois, has also reported this practice of the early-day settlers as related to him by his mother.

As a matter of fact, Warren does not believe the Canada thistle is too aptly named. Although it came to this country from Canada, the plant was actually imported to North America from Europe. It was brought into Canada by French missionaries.

Then, during revolutionary era, General Burgoyne brought horse hay in from Canada that contained the weed nuisance. It was first found growing in New York state.

From there, the Canada thistle has gained a toe hold throughout northern United States.

Today, although morning glory has the dubious honor of being Oregon's No. 1 weed nuisance, Warren says the Canada thistle holds a strong second place.

The specialist says the Canada thistle spreads both from wind-borne seed and through underground root stocks. Some of the vertical roots will go down into the soil ten feet or more.

Meanwhile, best news on the Canada thistle war front has been the development of 2,4-D. Both spring and fall applications are effective, although re-spraying is necessary to get a complete kill. That's because Canada thistle is a long-lived perennial.

Don White, county weed inspector, has just started his fall spray program, but urges land owners to do their own spot spraying as big equipment is usually not necessary.
