Bill McLean, left fielder, has enrolled at Southern Oregon College of Education, Ashland, to pursue his studies. Bill wants to be a teacher and coach, and he should make a good one.

Bill Jollie, first baseman, is undecided as to his plans but it is believed he will again return to Vanport College at Portland.
