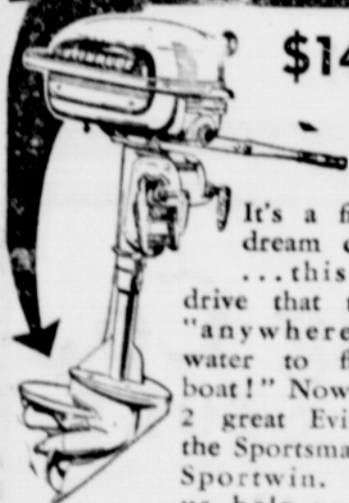

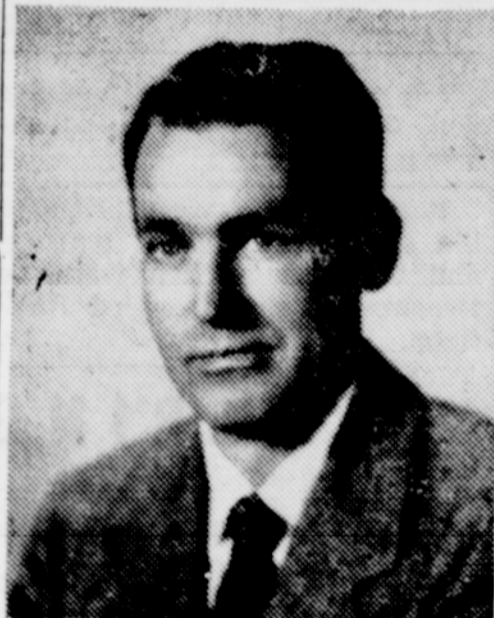
Mr. and Mrs. Elzie Duff have sold a part of their ocean-view property to Dr. and Mrs. Lloyd J. Goble.
