

Season Is Closed On Jack Salmon

Ray Gardner, of Gold Beach, state game commission man of the county, handed the Pilot the following letter, to apprise local fishermen of the closing of season on Jack Salmon. The letter is self-explanatory:

From Robert U. Mace, chief biologist of the Oregon state game commission: "I have checked with Rayner and Holloway regarding fishing for jack salmon after Oct. 20.

"They informed me that the season is closed on jack salmon after this date. Since all fish under 20 inches are classified as trout and there is no winter season on these fish, fishing is prohibited. The regulation is designed to protect cutthroat which are otherwise taken when fishing for jacks.

"This should clarify your question in regard to fishing for jack salmon after Oct. 15. Sincerely, C. A. Lockwood, State Game Director."
