fishermen be permitted to purchase a 2-day license for \$1 and that the highway commission take immediate action to improve low spots on Hwy 101 now blocked each year by flood waters.

The association's legislative committee report presented by George R. Goodrich, Tillamook, included: That a unified stand be taken against any legislation that would permit the state to lease tidelands, particularly on or along streams, to owners of abutting property; that legislation be adopted to restrict the wholesale prohibition of access to the new U. S. Highway 101, in connection with major widening and straightening.

That an increase in the number of road signs be halted or at least slowed until a satisfactory over-all plan can be worked out, that safe speed signs should be incorporated into "curve" or "slow" signs; that legislation be enacted to prevent stoppage of traffic at any point on Hwy 101; amendment of the school bus stop law to require buses to carry two signs, one to indicate stops not for the purpose of picking up or discharging passengers so as to permit traffic to proceed without a halt at such times; to require that tidelands purchased for oyster growing be developed within a reasonable length of time after purchase. Some such tidelands have not been used but are still closed to clam digging, it was stated.

Jack Hayes, deputy state civilian defense director, gave the main address at the Monday evening banquet. Mr. Hayes told the delegates that civilian defense "is not to be solved by oratory; people individually and in groups must recognize the answer lies in the minds and consciousness of everyone."

Leith Abbott, of Foote, Cone & Belding Advertising Agency, Portland, advised the coast people to attempt to stretch the coast's travel season by advertising off-season rates and playing up winter storms.

Good food and good beds were stressed by V. A. McNeil, head of Portland's Visitors Information Center, as being as important as scenery in taking care of tourists in Oregon. McNeil urged those in the tourist industry

to talk to their guests to learn how to improve their business.

The conclave came to a close with the annual fun night at which Arch B. Sanders, former manager, was master of ceremonies. A quiz type program with audience participation and musical interludes by Coos Bay talent occupied the evening hours.
