Second Storm Does Little Havoc Here

Although more than two inches of rain fell over the weekend and the rivers rose quite high in this section, no damage was reported, as was the case a few weeks ago in the first heavy storm.

The Rogue, on the rampage again at Grants Pass, never had high crest of the previous storm and the resulting high water in its lower reaches. However, the Smith River rose quickly, covered some lowland, but receded almost as quickly.

In the Eureka area, however, the story was considerably different this time. Escaping the fury of the previous storm, the area was plunged into darkness by washouts of several high-tension power lines. Bridges and roads were blocked for more than a day.

Another storm, now out at sea, has been forecast by the weather bureau.

While the Pacific coast was being drenched by water, the east and mid-west, again, were blanketed by snow and hit by another cold wave. Local residents just shiver to think of the plight of the east.
