SMITH RIVER—Anthony Rosa, Jr., 30, and his son, in company with Charles Penn, were boat riding and fishing on Smith River, above Dr. Fine Memorial Bridge, Sunday afternoon when their motor stopped, and the boat was caught in the current and hurled against a tree, fallen in the river, and capsized.

Penn was able to climb on the tree and reach the bank safely. The current carried Rosa and son away. Word was sent to Crescent City and a searching party arrived to search the river, in charge of Sheriff Glover. The boy's body was found early Monday and the father found later in the afternoon, in the vicinity where they had drowned.

Surviving are the widow and infant son and parents, Mr. and Mrs. Tony Rosa Sr. and other relatives near Crescent City.
