Mr. and Mrs. George Thomas and son of Los Angeles were callers at the Ray Struebing's Monday.

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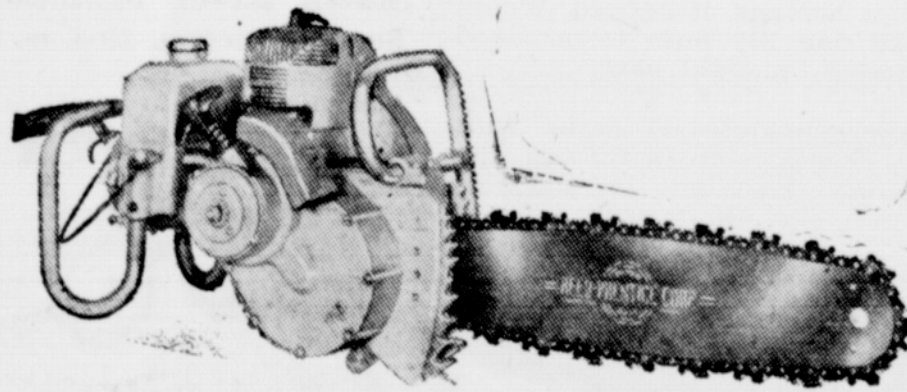
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
