LOCAL NEWS

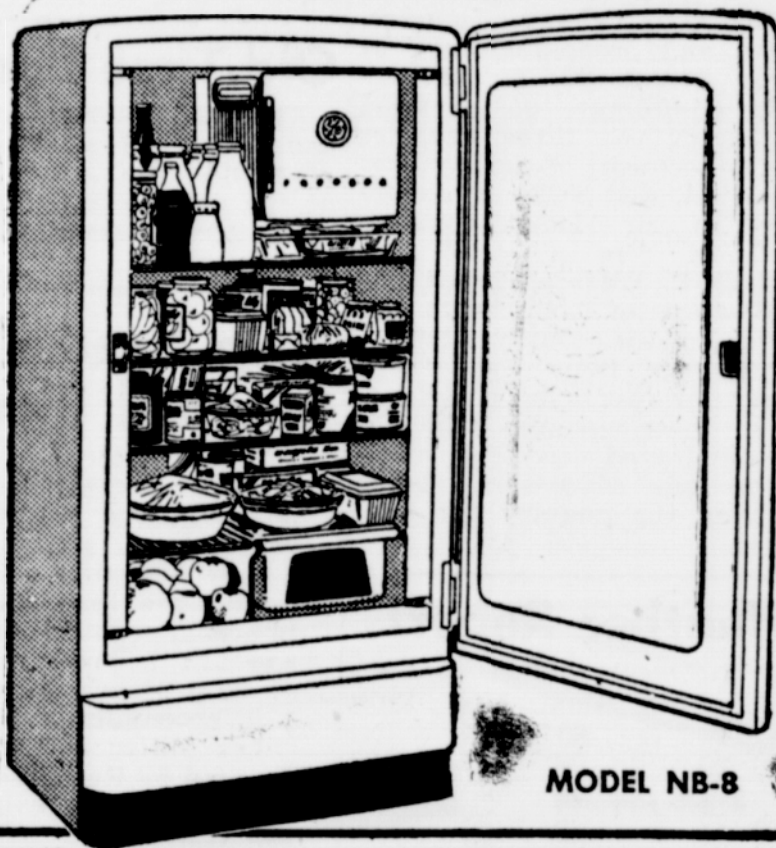
