GOLD BEACH—So you are planning to grow a garden this year? You will derive a lot of pleasure from your experiences in the garden this year. You might save some money, and you will also have good quality vegetables and a lot of satisfaction from the garden products that come direct from your garden and your own efforts.

If you are a novice at vegetable gardening, your county agent's office has a number of bulletins which will assist you in planning and growing your garden. This information comes in several booklets, free for the asking, and if read, will answer most of your garden problems for this year.

They are easy to read. These bulletins include when, how much, and what to plant for a family of four, how to get rid of common garden insects, what to do about damping off of seed-

lings, how to use booster solutions for vegetable transplants, management of the garden soil, how to make and use garden compost, and ways to make your garden produce fall and winter vegetables. A post card or a telephone call to your county agent's office will bring the packed in your mail.
