

Iron Lung Bought By S. W. Oregon

GOLD BEACH—According to John Porisch, county chairman of the March of Dimes campaign, \$750 has been taken from the Curry County chapter funds to apply on the purchase of an iron lung for use in southwestern Oregon counties. The lung cost \$25,000, paid by the counties of this section.

Since Sacred Heart Hospital, at Eugene, has the only polio ward in this section of the state, the lung is temporarily located at that place. According to Mr. Porisch, it takes special equipment to outfit such a ward, and few hospitals can afford this amount.

Southwestern Oregon has had but few cases of polio up to this date, thus the placing of the lung at Eugene.
