**P. M. A. News**

1951 PRACTICES and rates of Assistance: Seven Steps to Remember:

1. Phone or call at the county office BEFORE you start work.
2. Have your committeeman inspect the practice when prior inspection is required.
3. After prior approval is sent to you, go ahead and complete and report the practice before the expiration date.

4. Request an extension of time, if necessary, before the expiration date.

5. When practice is completed fill out and sign the Performance Report.

6. Have your committeeman inspect the practice and fill out his inspection report.

7. Return the Performance Report, along with performance evidence, before the expiration date.

**Constructing Permanent Riprap**

Permanent riprap will qualify for assistance under the 1951 program when constructed of rock, logs, woven wire, brush, piling and cable, singly, or in combination, to control erosion along stream banks. Prior and final inspection are required.

Rate of assistance: 50% of the cost, but not in excess of \$1.00 per square yard of exposed riprap surface, or,

50% of the cost, but not in excess of \$1.50 per cubic yard of riprap material used.

**Seeding Permanent Pastures on Cropland**

Assistance will be allowed for the seeding of recommended perennial grasses or legumes in approved pasture mixtures. Straight seeding may be approved in special instances. Assistance will not be given for reseeding on the same area at intervals of less than five years.

Rates of assistance: 50% of the cost of the seed but not in excess of \$6.00 per acre.

70% of the cost of the seed not to exceed \$8 per acre when nitrogen is applied at or near seeding time.

Suggested seeding mixtures for bottom lands in Curry county include:

- 5 lbs. English Ryegrass.
- 5 lbs. Alta Fescue.
- 5 lbs. Red Clover.
- 2 lbs. Ladina Clover.
- 3 lbs. Subterranean Clover.

On irrigated land ladino clover and alta fescue may make up the principal variety seeded.

**Application of Lining Materials**

The rate of application shall not be less than 1,400 pounds of pure calcium carbonate or its neutralizing equivalent per acre. Limestone must be ground fine enough so that 90% will pass
