through an 8-mesh sieve, with all fine particles left in the mixture.

Rate of assistance: 40% of the cost on a spread-on-the-land basis plus 30% of that part of \$2 per ton.

## Application of Superphosphates

Phosphate will qualify for assistance when applied to seedings of perennial or biennial legumes; legume and grass permanent pastures and subterranean clover. It must be applied at seeding time or immediately before. A minimum of 40 pounds available P2O5 must be applied per acre to qualify for assistance, or 225 pounds of 18% superphosphate.

Rate of assistance: 50% of the cost not to exceed 5c per pound of available P2O5.

## Controlling Perennial Weeds

Assistance under the 1951 PMA program will be given for the eradication or control in accordance with approved cultivation methods or by the use of approved chemicals on the following weeds for control: Canada thistle, bindweed, wild morning glory, Tansy Ragwort, Gorse, water hemlock, perennial smartweed, wild garlic, tussocks, quack

grass, wild parsnip, and St. John wort. Prior approval may be granted on only farm where reasonable efforts are made to follow approved weed control measures. Consult your county agent or your county committee for types of chemicals used in the control of specific weeds.

Rate of assistance: 50% of the cost of clean cultivation not to exceed \$7.50 per acre, except for quack grass.

50% of the cost for clean cultivation not to exceed \$5 per acre for quack grass.

50% of the cost of the following chemicals: Sodium chlorate, atticide, carbon bisulphide, ammate, 2,D4, 2,45-T.

The following practices are established to give assistance in the restoration and maintenance of permanent pastures:

Approved pasture mixtures recommended for Curry county non cropland and grazing land areas include:

4 lbs. per acre of English ryegrass; 6 lbs. per acre of alta fescue; half lb. per acre of highland bent; 2½ lbs. per acre of alsike and white clover mixed; 2 lbs. per acre of subterranean clover.

Mis mixture may vary somewhat according to soil types and moisture available on the respective range.

Rate of assistance: 60% of the cost of seed.

## Controlling Competitive Plants and Shrubs on non-cropland.

50% of the cost not to exceed \$5 per acre will be allowed in the control of following shrubs and plants: wild blackberry, poison oak, salal, snow brush, scrub oak, manzanita, grease wood, vine maple, rose broar, sticky laurel, Scotch broom and Irish furze. The method of control must be approved by the county committee prior to establishment of the practices. Where it is considered essential, in the establishment of legumes and grasses, temporary use of the land for other crops may be permitted.

This practice must be succeeded with a successful seeding program.

## Assistance for Constructing Stock Trails.

This practice is set up to assist stockmen to build trails to inaccessible grazing or watering areas, when such trails will promote a better distribution of the livestock. The trails must not be less than 2 feet wide at any point, must be properly drained to prevent water erosion, and must not have an average grade steeper than 20 per cent. No assistance will be given where the county committee determines that the grazing has been overgrazed.

Rate of assistance: 50% of the cost not to exceed \$4 per 100 linear feet.

## Establishment of Fireguards.

Fireguards must have a minimum width of 20 feet.

## Construction of Range Fences of a Permanent Nature.

This practice is established to permit better distribution of the grazing land and does not include repairs or maintenance of existing fences, and does not apply to the constructing of line or right-of-way fences.

Rate of assistance: 50% of the material not to exceed 55c per rod of barbed wire fence constructed.

50% of the cost of material not

to exceed 75c per rod of woven wire fence constructed.

50% of cost of material not to exceed \$1 per rod of timber or pole fence constructed.
