

Ore. Anti-Truman In Norblad "Poll" Released To Press

Fulton Lewis Jr. on his evening radio program recently asked his listeners to send to their members of congress the answer to sixteen questions.

Because of the heavy mail response which my office has had (about 1650 letters), I assume there is considerable interest in Oregon on this poll, and I am accordingly for your information reporting herewith the tabulation of answers which I received.

All questions were asked prior (two days) to the MacArthur firing, except No. 16 which was asked supplementally a day or two thereafter. All letters which I received and are herewith tabulated came from the state of Oregon with the great majority coming from my own congressional district. In reporting these tabulations I make no attempt to evaluate the accuracy of this type of poll:

1. As of today, would you vote for Harry Truman for President? Yes, 3; no, 1636.

2. Should President Truman be allowed to continue to receive the \$50,000 tax exempt salary recently voted him by Congress? Yes, 57; no, 1588.

3. Do you believe that congress should continue investigations such as the one into RFC loans and the Kefauver crime hearings and extend these investigations into other activities of government? Yes, 1627, no, 15.

4. Are you in favor of keeping Dean Acheson as secretary of state? Yes, 12; no, 1627.

5. Do you favor the United Nations being in final control of United States troops in Korea or elsewhere? Yes, 118; no, 1509.

6. Should Chiang Kai-shek be permitted to send his Nationalist armies against the Chinese Communists? Yes, 1596; no, 26.

7. Do you feel confident that Europe will fight to the end against Communism? Yes, 128; no, 1477.

8. Do you approve of the proposed continuation of economic, along with military, aid to North Atlantic pact nations? Yes, 279; no, 1373.

9. Would you favor a requirement that nations receiving military or economic aid from us must agree to stop trading with Russia, Communist China, or any other Iron Curtain country? Yes, 1594; no, 31.

10. Do you believe President Truman's statement that all communists and communist sympathizers have been weeded out of government? Yes, 4; no, 1633.

11. Are you in favor of a permanent peace program of University Military training? Yes, 887; no, 716.

12. Do you believe President Truman is making a sincere effort to cut out unnecessary government spending? Yes, 13; no, 1620.

13. Should wages be controlled along with prices? Yes, 1563; no, 64.

14. Should the government prevent strikes in time of war emergency? Yes, 1688; no, 46.

15. Are you in favor of calling General MacArthur home for a report to congress on the Far Eastern situation? Yes, 1417; no, 219.

16. Are you in favor of impeaching President Truman? Yes, 1317; no, 46.
